

**2026-2027 School Supply List**  
**2nd and 3rd grade**

\*2 inch quality binder

\*1 ½ inch quality binder

\*3 hole fabric pencil bag that zips (will be kept in binder)

\*1 standard plastic pencil box to keep individual supplies (no pouches or metal type please)

\*4 composition notebooks

\*4 plastic two pocket folders (1 must have holes and will be kept in binder, this one should be high quality)

\*2 three prong folders

\*1 box of Crayola broad line washable markers—10 or 12 count (please label each marker)

\*1 box 24 count Crayola crayons

\*3 yellow highlighters

\*3 red pens

\*1 box 24 count Crayola colored pencils

\*1 Fiskars scissors (Make sure that it is sized appropriately for your child's hands, kids get easily frustrated with scissors that are too small.)

\*2 white polymer eraser (not pencil top type but rectangular block type)

\*1 water bottle that closes firmly for your child to use that will be sent to and from school. (The bottle must not be larger than 10 inches in diameter, as it needs to fit in a designated spot. A push button, flip top lid, would be ideal.)

5 boxes of tissues

1 bottle white liquid school glue

12 glue sticks (no glitter or fancy kinds please)

1 package of pencil top erasers (standard type, please nothing fancy)

\*Ear plugs (optional—I have found that some kids find the noise in the classroom to be very distracting when they are working independently. For this reason I have some noise cancelling headphones in the classroom that the kids are welcomed to use. Some kids find them uncomfortable. If you think that your child could benefit from an alternative, ear plugs, you may want to purchase some. Another thought would be to wait and purchase them at a later time.
